## Principal's Message

Welcome Back Everyone! Each new year brings optimism and new beginnings. I am sure all of us are happy to put 2020 behind us. Thanks to everyone for complying with mask wearing and sanitizing every day to keep us all safe. We need to continue to be vigilant as we move into the New Year. As a reminder, teachers are continuing only with "face-to-face" instruction. This is quite different than the spring when teachers were doing remote learning. If your child is staying home due to COVID concerns, they are responsible for their own learning and they must connect with their teachers via Teams where teachers will be posting assignments. To move to the next level, students must demonstrate sufficient skills and knowledge in each course. Semester 1 is winding down with exams running Wednesday, January 27 to Friday, January 29th. Students are only required to attend exam days when they are writing. Semester 2 begins February 1<sup>st</sup>.

Course selection for the 2021-22 school year will begin in early February. Information will be posted on our website. Counsellors will be working with students to assist in course selections. Please make sure that your child is able to access their portal. If you need assistance, please contact Mrs. Goncalves.

Our counsellors and Indigenous Advocates, along with Admin will continue with the Breakfast program in the New Year. Thanks to PAC and a grant from The Children's Charity for supporting this initiative.

#### Capstone

The Capstone Project and CLC are requirements for graduation in British Columbia. In order to complete this graduation requirement all students must complete the following:



- 30 hours of Work/Volunteer/Work Experience Hours. 15 hours can be carried forward from summer and the remainder of the hours must be dated from September onward.
- Reflection Response on the impact of the work/volunteer experience
- Health & Wellness Plan
- Personal Pitch

All of this information can be found in the Teams app (Grad 2021) for students to complete and submit the work. Time slots have been opened for signing up for the Personal Pitch and can be found in the office for grads to schedule their presentation.

Bursary and Scholarship Application Form - The application form for school-based bursary and scholarships is now available in the office. All 2021 Grads are encouraged to complete the application as soon as possible. The deadline for return of completed applications is March 1<sup>st</sup>!

### **Career Education**

#### Are you a "Hidden Apprentice"?

...... If you are currently working in a job that is classified as a "Trade", you might qualify to be enrolled in the **Youth Work in Trades** as a Youth Apprentice. You could be eligible to earn 16 credits towards your graduation through the work you are doing in your job.

With course planning approaching, now is the time to think about opportunities in Trades where you could go to college as a high school student to pursue a career in the trades. Grade 11 and 12 students are eligible to be enrolled in the Youth Train in Trades program that gets you started on the technical training of a trade. You could earn both high school credits and college credits at the same time. Best part....the School District pays tuition!

#### **Women in Trades Bootcamp**

We will be hosting a two-day bootcamp for girls in Grade 10 interested in trying out a variety of trades. This two-day event will be a fun, hands-on experience where the students get to try four specific trades that may present some opportunities for the future. 


#### **RECON**
