
The Student Learning Surveys for grade 10 and 12 students will be completed shortly. We encourage all students to do their best on these assessments.

Some of the sites the group visited include the Anne Frank House, Passchendaele and the outpost where Canadian physician John MacRae treated wounded soldiers and wrote the famous poem, "In Flanders Fields". We went to Vimy Ridge and Juno Beach where we learned about the false harbour constructed by the Allies at Arromanches.

In Paris we got to experience the Paris Metro and visited places including Sacre Coeur in Montmartre where we took a guided walking tour through Montmartre which is famous for being home to artists like Picasso, Van Gogh, and the Moulin Rouge Theatre. 


