5. School Board Report:

- Administration and staff report the new restrictions regarding personal digital devices in the classrooms have been relatively well received and that classroom compliance by students has been high. These restrictions are as a result of the January 2024 mandate from the Provincial Government.
- Numeracy is a key priority for our district. Our District numeracy committee has
 made a lot of progress since last spring. Local teacher teams have design screening
 tools for students in grades 2 and 6 which are currently being piloted in schools.
 These screening tools will help to quickly identify areas where students are
 struggling so that they can be supported. The District is also bringing in targeted
 professional development opportunities in October to directly support teachers in
 their numeracy instructions.
- Administration reported that the District is providing a four-part after school series around "Reclaiming Our Students: Why children are more anxious, aggressive and shut down than ever" by Hannah Beach. Educators from Kindergarten to Grade 4 will come together to learn more about what is happening for children in our classrooms and what we can do to support them.
