Mrs. Podmorow and Link Crew organized our Terry Fox Run last week. Together, staff and students raised over \$3,600 for cancer research. Congratulations everyone for your generous support.

Athletic teams are in full swing thanks to the organization of our Athletic Director, Mr. Podmorow. This year for the fall sports, we have volleyball and field hockey with over 100 students participating on one or more teams. We wish all student athletes a fun and positive season and a huge thank you to all the coaches who are volunteering their time to work with our kids.

The cafeteria is again up and running with delicious food being prepared by our students under the guidance of Mr. Deyer. The monthly menu has been posted on our website. Overdue Student Fees

All students must pay a \$30 student activity fee. This covers locker costs, and activities throughout the year. Even if your child does not want a locker, they still must pay the activity fee. New students are required to pay a \$35 textbook deposit in addition to student fees. This will be returned at the end of their tenure at SOSS once all books have been returned in good condition. Math students may be required to purchase a workbook.

All outstanding student fees are now due! Payments can be made by cash, cheque, debit, credit card or online using <u>Student Quick Pay</u>. You can create an account with your own email address and password. You will also need the student number and last name of each student you wish to add to your account. COVID Isolation

Ending isolation if you are fully vaccinated OR less than 18 years of age:

If you tested positive and are managing your illness at home you can end isolation when all 3 of these conditions are met:

- 1. At least 5 days have passed since your symptoms started, or from the test date if you did not have symptoms.
- 2. Fever has resolved without the use of fever-reducing medication, such as acetaminophen or ibuprofen.
- 3. Symptoms have improved.

The second annual Grads vs. Staff Food Drive is happening this week! The losing team (the team that has the LEAST amount of food) cooks the winning team a gourmet lunch!







Junior Girls Volleyball (Yellow Team)

Volleyball is alive at SOSS with over 25 girls trying out at the grade 9 and 10 levels. This meant enough interest for us to enter two teams into the league: Team Green and Team Yellow.

The yellow team, coached by Ms Smith and Ms Seymour, are developing through two weekly practices and one night of matches per week. Last week, on September 29th, our yellow team traveled to Osoyoos to play two matches. The first match, against home squad OSS, exposed some of our nerves and inexperience. The girls are still learning rotation and serve reception, so this was a great opportunity to transfer our practice skills to game situations. After losing the first set they rallied nicely to win the second set and send it to a third set decider. OSS

ultimately won the deciding set, however, the team showed good grit and determination. The second match against Princeton allowed for all players to get on the court and improve their understanding of game play and positioning. These are important skills to take into the remainder of the season.

The game ended in a scoreless tie, but with players happy with their effort. Along with five senior players, the team heads to Chilliwack this week for a tournament. 
