SENIOR GIRLS VOLLEYBALL MAKE SOSS HISTORY

The Senior Girls Volleyball Team had a historical and memorable season. With only a handful of seniors, the team brought up several grade 10 players, and the group clicked quickly. They were committed to learning, training, playing hard, and having fun together. The girls were pushed harder than ever this year, and they responded with determination, improving their skills and their understanding of the game every step of the way.

The team earned the title of South Zone Champions, which sent

them to the Okanagan Valley Championship in Merritt. There, they faced the strongest teams in the valley and battled their way into the bronze final to play against a powerful Merritt squad. In a best of five match, they traded wins back and forth. In the deciding set, SOSS was down 9-3 but fought back with grit to win 16-14, securing their spot at the BC Provincial Championships. They became the first ever girls volleyball team to make provincials from SOSS! At provincials, the girls started strong, winning their first three matches with incredible support from our school community and Fan Bus. In the opening playoff round, they met the fourth ranked team in the province. Although they led at times, they couldn't quite find their rhythm and moved to the consolation bracket. From there, they continued to compete hard, playing solid volleyball and representing themselves and SOSS with pride. We are incredibly proud of this team, both for what they achieved and for their dedication throughout the season. Congratulations to the graduating seniors, Ava Kosaka and Paige Lougheed for their tireless dedication from grade 8-12 as a volleyball Hornet! They will be deeply missed in the years to come, but they have left a legacy for the next wave of girls to play volleyball at SOSS. 
