Sexual Orientation and Gender Identify (SOGI) is not a separate curriculum. SOGI-inclusive education encompasses a broad range of topics including identity and inclusion. SOGI-inclusive education is not centered in sexuality. There are often misconceptions about what SOGI-inclusive education is and what it looks like. Here is a common myth and the corresponding facts about SOGI-inclusive education:

MYTH: SOGI-inclusive Education violates parents' rights.

FACT: SOGI-inclusive education is meant to compliment parents' efforts in teaching essential values of tolerance, respect, and acceptance of all people. It does not undermine parental rights but rather contributes to a greater understanding of diversity and inclusion for all students and families.

FinS (Fish in School) is a program through ONA (Okanagan Nation Alliance) where salmon spawn are brought into various schools to be raised to fry. Once they reach the Fry stage they are released at the salmon ceremony in May.

Course Selections

It is time to start thinking about course planning and selections for next year already. Students in grade 8 will be visited by the scheduling team next week to go over the process and options for next year. Students in grade 8 are able to prioritize their elective choices and their academic courses are automatically chosen for them with the exception of Math.

Students in grades 9-11 are asked to login to MyBlueprint to explore the courses that are being offered and the courses they need to complete for graduation. These are the instructions for logging in and completing the Grad Planner for course selections for next year. The scheduling team will be visiting students in classes over the next few weeks to advise students on options and selections.


Information Technology 8


Transitioning into grade 8 is challenging for most students. One of the many new things our students face is the amount of new technology they encounter. SpacesEDU, MyEd, MyBlueprint, and Teams are just some of the many apps and programs they encounter. To help students navigate these changes, we provide a mandatory course called Information Technology 8. Not only are students taught how to log into and use these programs, but they also learn some of the challenges of being a digital citizen and receive an introduction to coding. One of the most rewarding parts of teaching this course is the conversations and interactions between students when they are problem solving. The support and collaboration which develops over the term is amazing!

Science 10

In Science 10 this semester students have been inquiring into the process of natural selection and the theory of evolution. In order to look at these topics in a more hands on manner, students were challenged to execute an experiment which modelled these concepts. Using paper cups, students looked at the preferential feeding habits of birds given choices of "prey" with different traits. Experiments included changing the colours, locations and even odours of the cups. This opportunity allowed students to engage with science in a messy, yet meaningful way. Interested in the outcomes? Information for Students - January 2024 Final Exams

Report any exam conflicts to Mrs. Koffler in the office immediately. All conflict exams will be written on Wednesday morning in room 202 unless you arrange something different directly with your teacher

Students must stay in the exam room for a minimum of one hour after the start of their exam

Bring all writing utensils needed for exam (pencils, pens, erasers)

When exams are in session, please remain quiet in the upstairs hallways and the main floor hallway near the drama room

Student may use the library for quiet study

Students only need to be present for their exams and are expected to be off of school grounds when they are not writing or studying in the library
