PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

We are on the home stretch of this school year as we have less than two months left. Report cards have been posted and we will be working closely with those students who still need to complete outstanding course work. We are currently designing the 2022-23 timetable. Counsellors will be having discussions with parents and students regarding appropriate placements for next year.

This is an exciting time for the Grads. District Dogwood Authority presentations will be held on Tuesday, May 10th, and the Francis Family Scholarship application is due May 13th. Please check in the office for additional information. Grad fees are due May 11th. Please pay \$150 to the office as soon as possible (check with Ms. Matthews if you have done fundraising). A reminder that meat and flower pick up is Friday May 6th between 3:30pm – 6:00pm. SOGI 123 @ SOSS



SOGI 123 stands for **S**exual **O**rientation and **G**ender **I**dentity. 1 2 3 stands for the three prong approach of Policies and Procedures, Inclusive Environments, and Teaching Resources.

WHY SOGI? Because everyone has a Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity. Homophobia and transphobia affect all students whether they identify as 2SLGBTQIA+ or not. What the heck does 2SLGBTQIA+ stand for? Here's a great definition that comes from UBC's Equity and Inclusion Office - Equity & Inclusion Glossary of Terms

2SLGTBQIA+ - Two Spirit, Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans, Queer (or Questioning), Intersex, Asexual. The placement of the Two Spirit (2S) first is to recognize that Indigenous people are the first peoples of this land and their understanding of gender and sexuality precedes colonization. The '+' is for all the new and growing ways we become aware of sexual orientations and gender diversity.



INDIGENOUS DEPARTMENT

Indigenous leadership group spent Earth Day morning cleaning the "flats" on McKinny Rd. The area they helped to remove garbage from is the spot that Speetlum (bitterroot – one of the 4 food chiefs of Syilx) grows and is harvested.

Classes joined the Indigenous department to go and pick Speetlum. This root is a sacred plant to the Syilx. It is dug up and the heart (seed) is planted back into the ground. This root is used as a food source, and like its name (Bitterroot) it has a bitter taste.

Upcoming:

May 5th is Red Dress day. This is a day to recognize and create awareness of all the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, children, men, and two spirit persons. We welcome conversations and offer a trigger warning as this subject can be a touchy one. We welcome everyone to wear red on this day.

Also happening on this day is the district wide stick game tournament. and the release of our salmon fry. The gathering room helped to raise the sockeye salmon from eggs to the fry stage. All schools in the district will be gathering to release the salmon fry.

May 12th is Moosehide Campaign Day and Moosehide pins will be handed out. This day is normally held in February, but due to covid it was postponed to May. This is a grassroots project that creates awareness of men and boys taking a stand against violence against women.
