## **PSYCHOLOGY**

This term, the Psychology 12 class is expanding their learning of human development with the adoption of the REAL CARE robot baby simulation program. This project allows students to explore some of the qualities of being a parent/caregiver as well as addressing some of the medical, psychological, and financial responsibilities while they care for infants over 3-5 school days. They reflect on their added responsibilities and emotional responses while coping with the needs of the babies while attending school. Some participant comments:

### Information for Students - January 2025 Final Exams

Report any exam conflicts to Mrs. Koffler in the office immediately. All conflict exams will be written on Tuesday morning in room 202 unless you arrange something different directly with your teacher

Students must stay in the exam room for a minimum of one hour after the start of their exam

No phones or other electronic devices in the exam rooms except for calculators which will be checked by the supervising teacher

Busses will run at the regular times during exam week

Bring all writing utensils needed for exam (pencils, pens, erasers)

Students can bring a water bottle into the exam. Please do not bring food into an exam as it can be a distraction for peers

When exams are in session, please remain quiet in the upstairs hallways and the main floor hallway near the drama room

Students may use the library for quiet study

Students only need to be present for their exams and are expected to be off of school grounds when they are not writing or studying in the library
