Principal's Message

Happy spring, everyone! Planning for the 2022-23 school year is now in full swing. Over the past 6 weeks counsellors have been working with students to plan courses for next year. They will also be visiting our elementary schools as part of our Grade 7 Transition plan. Very soon we will be building the timetable based on student requests.

As a reminder, the end of the term is Wednesday, April 20. Report cards will be available to be accessed digitally the following week. If your child has received an "I" report, this is an indication that they are at risk of not being successful in a specific course. If your son or daughter needs extra support in one of their classes, please contact their teacher immediately.

Grads don't forget to check out the additional Scholarship and Bursary applications in the office. The deadlines are coming up quickly. Meat and Flower fundraising sheets are also available in the office. The deadline for submissions is Friday, April 14th. Our Graduation Ceremony will be held on Tuesday, June 28th. (more information to follow). Our next grad parent meeting is Wednesday, April 20 at 5:15pm on TEAMS. Grad fees are \$150 and are due May 11.

The Literacy and Numeracy Assessments for grade 10 students will be completed during the week of April 25-28. We encourage all students to do their best on these assessments. Times and dates are posted in the front foyer. See Mrs. Koffler if you have any questions.

We are very excited that our grade 9 students will be going on the Gardom Lake trip May 30-June 1. The parent meeting will be on Tuesday, April 12 at 6:30pm in the library. We are still looking for parents to join our parent committee. Although much fundraising was done two years ago, there is a \$75 fee for this three-day trip as costs have gone up significantly. Please get fees into the office by April 14. Online payment is available.

There was announcement from the Minister of Education, in collaboration with the First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC) about the implementation of the new requirement of an Indigenous-focused graduation requirement for all students. This is part of the province's commitments to truth, reconciliation, and anti-racism. This is an important policy decision in the education sector on truth and reconciliation that is inclusive of all students and shows the importance of the work and learning for each student in their future to be an educated citizen. This new requirement is expected to involve a phased-in approach that would come into full effect in the 2023/24 school year. We will be implementing English First Peoples 11 starting in the fall.
