#### **RECON**



The research and education collaborative occultation network (RECON) group was out with the telescope on Wednesday, Feb 9<sup>th</sup> and successfully gathered data for the occultation event of trans-Neptunian object 96TP66.

The RECON group is an international citizen science program that deploys over 60 telescopes across the United States and Canada to gather data about objects in the Kuiper belt. The Kuiper belt is outside the orbit of Neptune and therefore far enough away from

the sun to have not changed since their formation during the early stages of our solar system. So, by learning more about these trans-Neptunian objects, we learn more about conditions in our early solar system.

The RECON group is open to any and all students interested in astronomy and doing actual scientific research. Please talk to Mrs. McIntyre if you are interested.

Indigenous Ed is busy preparing for an upcoming tournament with the other schools in the district featuring two traditional games: Stick Games and Double Ball. Stick Games consists of "bones" (smaller sticks, one is marked one is unmarked, the unmarked one is the one to find). The objective of the game is to hide bones from opponents and guess where their unmarked bone is, and if correctly guessed you gain your opponents' bone. The winning team collects all the bones. Double Ball is like lacrosse and uses a stick to carry, pass, and throw a double ball (two smaller balls filled with sand attached by a leather hide). These games are open for everyone to sign up!

Boys' and girls' group is running every Wednesday afternoon. If any indigenous students are interested, please see the Advocates in the gathering room.

The Leadership Crew has been working with Tara and Marvin, and for Valentine's Day a home-made meal of chicken soup with cupcakes, cookies, and fried Bannock was delivered to the elders on the reserve.


