Overdue Student Fees

<u>All students</u> must pay a \$25 student activity fee. This covers locker costs, and activities throughout the year. Even if your child does not want a locker, they still must pay the activity fee. <u>New students</u> are required to pay a \$35 textbook deposit in addition to student fees. This will be returned at the end of their tenure at SOSS once all books have been returned in good condition. <u>Math students</u> may be required to purchase a workbook; cost varies by class.


INDIGENOUS DEPARTMENT
