CAREER LIFE CONNECTIONS

Career Life Connections 12 is a required course for graduation. Parents of Grade 12 students - please check in with your child to make sure all assignments have been submitted and that Capstone projects are ready to present this month. DUAL CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES

Dual Credit programs enable students to earn both high school graduation credits as well as credit at Post Secondary while still in high school. Students need to be in grade 11 or 12 to enroll in these programs and they are filling up. See Mr. Kitt for details.

Tuition is paid by the School District.... Yes... Tuition is paid!

TRADES

Students can enroll in a "Foundation" program, in the Trades. Programs vary in length from 24-40 weeks. This usually means a student will attend a post-Secondary program for one semester of high school.

These programs take students with little or no experience and provide them with the skills necessary to get hired in their chosen trade.

GATEWAY PROGRAMS

Gateway to Trades: 12 Week program with Okanagan College where students get to try a variety of construction trades. Starts in February 2024

Gateway to Tech: Partnered with Okanagan College. Students get to try a variety of computer programming outcomes. This popular program will go in the evenings, 2 days per week (5:00 pm- 8:30pm) Start in September 2023

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Students can jump start their career in Early Childhood Education with Okanagan College in Penticton. This program will begin in September 2023 with classes occurring online in the evenings and in-class sessions occurring on one Saturday per month in Penticton. Students will achieve Early Childhood Education Assistant certification through completion of this program. If they wish to continue with their studies, they have a jump start on the courses required

BUSINESS PROGRAMS

Students can get started in Business Admin Certificate programs at Okanagan College while still enrolled in high school. This program can be taken in either Kelowna or Penticton.





INDIGENOUS DEPARTMENT

May is shaping up to be a busy month! On May 4th we will be releasing the salmon fry into the water that the gathering room has been taking care of since they were eggs. May 5th is Red Dress Day; everyone is encouraged to wear red to honour and remember the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls and Two-Spirit People across Canada. The Moose Hide Campaign Day is on May 11th. This campaign is a BC-born, Indigenous-led grassroots movement to engage men and boys in ending violence towards women and children. 
