Course Selections

Course Selections for next year are underway. On our school website, under Academics and Course Planning Process, there is information on how to complete this process. Students will have had an informational session with the counselling team to outline required courses and elective choices for their grade.

- 1. See website for <u>Course Offerings Booklet</u> and <u>presentations</u> (PowerPoints, movies, infographics) from teachers to help explore the courses before making your selections.
- 2. Use the Course Selection Form (provided in the counselling session or printed off website) to indicate the courses you want. Make sure to select enough courses for a full schedule and to include alternate choices in case your ideal schedule cannot be created.
- 3. Login to MyEd using your student account and follow <u>these instructions</u> to input your choices into the system. Return your Course Selection Form with a parent/guardian signature to the library.

All requests are to be entered into the MyEd Student Portal using student accounts and the Course Selection Form to be filled in, signed by a parent/guardian, and returned to Mrs. Goncalves in the Library by February 12th.

Please remember to check our grad page on the school website regularly to learn about important dates and scholarship opportunities. Deadlines are approaching quickly. It's also important for Grads to be checking the Grad 2021 Teams page as well as the Grad Group on Instagram (@SOSSGRADCOMMITEE2021)

If your student has applied to any post-secondary institutions, please be sure they check their email account regularly. The information schools send is very important and often time sensitive. Don't forget to check each institution's Financial Aid section as there may be scholarship and bursaries to apply for.

Speaking of Scholarships and Bursaries, the deadline to apply for School Based Bursaries and Scholarships is March 1st. Application forms can be picked up in the office. There are some supplementary documents required and we suggest that students apply sooner rather than later as it may take a little time to get the application package together.

Grad Photos are scheduled to begin Monday, March 1st. Please make sure you have signed up for a time in the office. Students can check in with the office if they have forgotten their time. At this time, grads can book in as a group with a maximum of 5 people. This is subject to change with any changes from the PHO and at the discretion of Mountain West Studios.

All Grads should have signed up in the office for their Capstone Personal Pitch. All other CLC/Capstone work is now overdue and needs to be submitted online. Parents please ask your graduate about their Capstone work and Personal Pitch.

This is the start of the final semester of highschool. Please be aware of the very real epidemic that often occurs called "Senioritis". Please remind your graduate to prioritize school and their learning, so they can have a positive and successful final semester at SOSS.

We will be holding some virtual planning meetings for Grad in the coming months. These will be held on Teams and your grad will have to help you connect to that meeting.
