

# **RECON**

The SOSS RECON group is up and running again, and looking for committed members to take part in this scientific investigation. RECON is an international space research initiative between the US and Canada that gathers data on occultation events for trans-Neptunian objects (otherwise known as objects in the Keiper belt of our solar system). The RECON group goes out on designated nights with a 12" Dobsonian telescope and a telescope camera to record these occultation events. The members involved not only get the opportunity to take part in authentic scientific research, but they may also become published scientific authors on a RECON event publication.

# **News from PAC**

With two meetings behind us, the SOSS Parent Advisory Council (PAC) has started off the year by providing funding to SOSS's student-led "Breakfast Club" and other projects by our "Student Voice". We are proud of the creativity and enthusiasm the students are showing for these volunteer initiatives and look forward to seeing what's in store for the balance of 2019/20. PAC is also assisting with funding a joint Art Club and Retro Games Club endeavor.



Students together with teaching staff are encouraged to apply for PAC funding which comes from our Provincial Gaming Grant. Applications are reviewed every meeting. Past PAC initiatives include, but are not limited to, funding for special field trips and transportation, team gear (field hockey and Ultimate), club supplies, tech, and PAC Scholarships.

We've had lots of discussion about teen vaping, school safety, new courses offered, updates on District programs, and the new grading assessments for Grades 8 and 9.

PAC offers an opportunity to be involved in the student experience (eg. by providing funding for some extracurricular activities, field trips, clubs); while providing parents with a place to voice concerns and issues, and receive direct feedback from the school administration and School Board Trustee.
