
Mental Health Booster

The Mental Health Booster Program is underway for students at SOSS. The purpose of the program is to teach students about their mental health, empower them with understanding about how their brain and hormones work, and introduce mindful techniques and strategies to help them cope with everyday and extraordinary stressors in their lives.

Those who have opted in to the program have been placed in small grade groups, and are meeting twice a month with Mrs. Stopa. So far, students are reporting that they feel more calm, relaxed and grounded.

Here is a technique called Box Breathing that the Grade 11's learned last month:

The Grade 9's & 10's are working on "fogging the mirror" and "ocean breath". They practiced focusing their thoughts on their inhales, then their exhales. This practice of being in the moment with their breath will help minimize fight, flight or freeze responses when they feel triggered and allow them to return more quickly to a "thinking" state when their brain does go "offline." The program is set to run all year, and has room for more participants. Foods 9/10

This month in Ms. Frank's Foods 9/10 classes, students have been studying Indigenous Food sources with our IEA Shan Peltier. Students began by watching a documentary on Food Sovereignty and Food Cycles sparking great discussion. They are currently researching local food sources to create informative posters for the school hallways and were treated to a fantastic cook off with proteins donated by Shan and OIB. Students learned how to traditionally cook salmon, sheep, elk and venison paired with a Three Sister salad (zucchini, beans and corn), wild rice pilaf with morel mushrooms, roasted carrots and a wild blueberry dessert.
