ULTIMATE PROGRAM





EXECUTIVE FUNCTIONING SKILLS—ORGANIZATION


One of the SOSS inquiry groups is focusing on supporting grade 8s and 9s in their executive functioning skills. We are starting with Organization as our first theme for the grade 9 students. These however are helpful strategies for all of our students.

Examples:

- Arrives at school with the required materials.
- Keeps homework and handouts neatly organized in binder, with dividers.
- Meets deadlines for assignments, homework and tests.
- Time management (example managing screen time and homework time).

How to help improve organization skills:

- Check-lists for assignments.
- Organizer to keep track of school work due dates.
- Regularly checking binder and supplies needed.
- Creating routines.
- Clean out backpack each day.
- Checking off completed homework.
